The Wise Men

Matthew 2:1-12



- Wise men came from the East to Jerusalem looking for a baby that had been born King of the Jews. "For we have seen His star in the East and have come to worship Him," they declared. They had seen a star in the East and had followed it there. When King Herod heard about the wise men, he sent for the priests and scribes to tell him where this king was to be born, and they told him in Bethlehem. Herod told the wise men that they would find the young Child in Bethlehem.
- When the wise men left the city, they found that the star moved. They followed the star to the house where Mary, Joseph, and Jesus were now staying. The wise men worshiped Jesus and gave him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.
- God told the wise men not to go back to Herod, but to go home another way.

- Do you give God your best?




